### Primary Duties of the Position:

The incumbent in this position will assist in the laboratory testing efforts of the Federal Milk Market Administrator located in Bothell, Washington. This office verifies milk testing for payment of farmers in Federal Orders 124 and 131 (Pacific Northwest and Arizona Marketing Areas). Tests pertain primarily to fat, protein, lactose, and solids content of raw milk by infrared and wet chemical techniques. Analytical duties include mastery of all procedures related to the above as well as rigorous spreadsheet and graphical analysis of data. The candidate will be expected to interact with industry representatives via telephone and written correspondence. Special projects may include testing method improvement and detailed analysis of data in a database. Other duties include lab equipment maintenance, report generation, and daily sample management.

#### **Qualification Requirements:**

Applicants must have a bachelor's degree in a physical or life science with at least 15 semester hours in chemistry, microbiology, or dairy and food related sciences AND at least 6 semester hours of mathematics or physics.

Applicants who do not have a degree must have the appropriate semester or quarter hours as described above <u>and</u> experience that, when combined with the education, would equal a four-year course of study. The experience should have equipped the applicant with the necessary skills and knowledge to perform at the grade level to which appointed.

The required amount of experience and education will not in itself be accepted as proof of qualification for the position. The candidate's record of experience must demonstrate that the candidate possesses the ability to perform the duties of the position. A copy of your college transcript is required.

#### Special Requirements:

Must be a United States citizen. Must undergo a medical examination.

# Evaluation Criteria:

Candidates who meet the requirements described above will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Ability to accurately perform a variety of wet chemical and instrumental methods related to determination of milk composition.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Word and Excel or similar computer software, including the ability to electronically analyze (i.e. knowledge of computer spreadsheet/plotting/database applications, and statistics) and interpret data and draw appropriate conclusions.
- Knowledge of laboratory safety, chemical hygiene, good laboratory practices, and maintenance of laboratory instruments and other mechanical devices.
- Ability to communicate in an effective and professional manner, both in written and oral presentation.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team.
