The objective of a Federal Milk Market Administrator's office is to administer the terms and provisions of regulations referred to as a Federal milk order. Federal milk orders establish minimum prices that regulated dairy plants and milk handlers must pay Grade A dairy farmers for milk, based on how the milk is used. The milk order requires that these payments be pooled so that dairy farmers under an order are paid an average price for their milk, regardless of how it is used.

Primary Duties of the Position:

Maintain publications and internal reports of statistical material using databases of reported information. Generate reports and analyses. Act as a liaison between the dairy industry and the Market Administrator's office concerning reported information. Duties may also require processing handler information including pool reports, handler statements, and producer payrolls.

Qualification Requirements:

- Applicants must hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in economics, business administration, agriculture, agricultural economics, agricultural business, accounting, statistics, mathematics, marketing, or dairy science.
- Applicants who do not have a degree must have at least 2 ½ years general experience in one or
 more aspects of agricultural marketing functions such as distribution, inspection, storage,
 transportation, merchandising, standardizing, etc. The duties and responsibilities should have
 equipped the applicant with the necessary skills and knowledge to perform at the grade level of the
 position to be filled.

The required amount of experience and education will not in itself be accepted as proof of qualification for the position. The candidate's record of experience must demonstrate that the candidate possesses the ability to perform the duties of the position. A copy of your unofficial college transcript is required when applying for the position.

Evaluation Criteria:

Candidates who meet the requirements described above will be evaluated on the following criteria to determine the best qualified:

- Ability to communicate in an effective and professional manner, both in written and oral presentation.
- Ability to analyze, evaluate and interpret complex data/information and draw appropriate conclusions.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team.
- Proficiency in word processing, spreadsheet, and/or database software.
- Knowledge of the terms and provisions of Federal milk orders is helpful.

Special Requirements:

- Must be a United States citizen.
- Males born after December 31, 1959, must be registered with the Selective Service.
- Required to pass a background investigation and fingerprint check.
- Subject to satisfactory completion of one-year probationary period.

Application Procedures:
