MARKET SUMMARIES FOR DECEMBER

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 806.8 million pounds of milk to the market during December. Daily deliveries averaged 26.0 million pounds, up 7.8 percent from November. An estimated 519 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 50,145 pounds, up 7.8 percent from November.

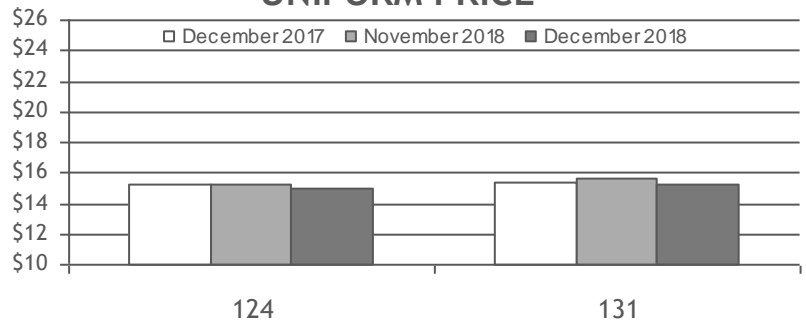
Class I producer milk during December totaled 169.4 million pounds, 21.0 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.5 million pounds, up 9.4 percent from November. ▼

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 444.6 million pounds of milk to the market during December. Daily deliveries averaged 14.3 million pounds, up 3.9 percent from November. An estimated 82 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 174,890 pounds, up 3.9 percent from November.

Class I producer milk during December totaled 105.1 million pounds, 23.6 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.4 million pounds, down 6.0 percent from November. ▼

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net increase of 2.93 cents between the December 15 and the January 12 surveys, to \$1.4272 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a net increase of 1.57 cents to \$1.3279 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net decrease of 0.44 cents between the weeks ending December 15 and January 12 from \$2.2530 per pound to \$2.2486 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 4.21 cents since mid-December to \$0.9478 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net increase of 0.90 cents since mid-December to \$0.4762 per pound.
