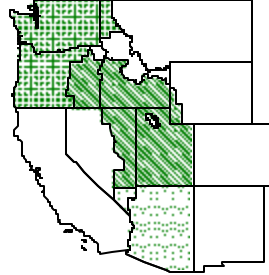

### MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JUNE 2002

Comparisons to a year ago can be found in the tables on pages 6 and 7.

#### Pacific Northwest

Producers delivered a total of 668.3 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 22.3 million pounds, up less than 0.1 percent from May. An estimated 972 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 22,919 pounds, up less than 0.1 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 149.5 million pounds, 22.4 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.0 million pounds, down 16.8 percent from May.

#### Arizona-Las Vegas

Producers delivered a total of 256.4 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 8.5 million pounds, down 6.5 percent from May. An

estimated 108 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 79,135 pounds, down 6.5 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 71.8 million pounds, 28.0 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 2.4 million pounds, down 12.5 percent from May.

#### Western

Producers delivered a total of 510.0 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 17.0 million pounds, up 8.5 percent from May. An estimated 792 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 21,467 pounds, up 8.5 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 81.4 million pounds, 16.0 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 2.7 million pounds, down 4.6 percent from May.

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**JUNE 2002 CLASS PRICES**

June 2002 non-advanced Class Prices were calculated using NASS commodity price surveys from June 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29, 2002. Component prices for the month are \$2.0148 per pound of protein, \$1.1211 per pound of butterfat, \$0.0247 per pound of other solids, and \$0.7605 per pound of nonfat solids.

June 2002 Class III and IV prices at 3.5% butterfat are \$10.09 and \$10.52 per hundredweight, respectively. The June Class III price compared to May is down \$0.73. The Class III price is \$4.93 lower than June 2001. The Class III price at 3.67% butterfat is \$0.37 above the support price of \$9.90 at 3.67% butterfat.

Class II butterfat was also announced at \$1.1281 per pound. Class I skim and butterfat and Class II skim prices for June 2002 were announced on May 17, 2002. The Class II price at 3.5% butterfat is \$11.19 for June 2002.

**Current Commodity Prices** -- The NASS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a decrease in prices received for 40-pound blocks and 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a decrease of 7.47 cents between the June 15 and the July 13 surveys, to \$1.0933 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (**adjusted to 38% moisture**) showed a decrease of 6.85 cents to \$1.0739 per pound.

The NASS butter price showed a net decrease of 5.02 cents between the weeks ending June 15 and July 13 from \$1.0604 per pound to \$1.0102 per pound.

The NASS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 0.20 cents since mid-June to \$0.9025 per pound.

The average price for NASS whey showed a net decrease of 1.09 cents since mid-June to \$0.1539 per pound. ♦

**AUGUST'S CLASS I PRICE ANNOUNCEMENT**

On July 19, the August 2002 Class I price was announced at \$12.38 for the Pacific Northwest and Western Orders, and \$12.83 for the Arizona-Las Vegas Order. The Class I price was calculated using NASS commodity price surveys from the weeks of July 6 and 13.

The July Class III and IV advance skim prices are \$5.77 and \$6.86 per hundredweight, respectively. The butterfat portion of the Class I mover decreased 4.21 cents from \$1.1443 to \$1.1022 per pound.

The August 2002 Class II skim and nonfat solids prices were also announced on July 19. The skim price is \$7.56 per hundredweight, and the nonfat solids price is \$0.8400 per pound for all Federal orders. ♦

**DISCONTINUATION OF COST OF PRODUCTION ESTIMATES**

USDA Economics Research Service will be discontinuing estimates of monthly milk cost of production (COP) effective with the data provided on 5/31/02 in the Federal Order *Announcement of Minimum Class and Component Prices: Final* for June 2002. ERS has recently developed a new approach for computing milk COP estimates using data from the 2000 Agricultural Resource Management Study of dairy farmers. As a result, the procedure for calculating the monthly estimates no longer is usable and is not being updated. Therefore, Dairy Programs will not be providing monthly milk COP estimates with the Class price announcement, beginning on July 5. **FIRST HALF U.S.  
MILK PRODUCTION UP 2.69%**

Milk production for the first half of 2002 was up 2.69% for the U.S. and 2.58% for the top 20 states compared with the same period in 2001. The U.S. total for the first six months of 2002 equaled 86,206 million pounds, 2,258 million pounds more than last year. The table below shows data for January through June, 2002, for the selected states with comparisons to year-ago levels.

Milk production in June 2002 was up 2.19% for the U.S. compared with June 2001. The table on page 8 shows data for June 2002, with comparisons to June 2001. ♦

**PRODUCERS AND PRODUCER MILK BY  
ORDER, STATE, AND COUNTY,  
MAY 2002**

During the month of May 2002, a total of 1,871 producers, on a combined basis, were associated with the Pacific Northwest, Western, and Arizona-Las Vegas Orders. These producers delivered a total of 1,459.4 million pounds of milk to the markets during the month. The table on page 4 contains the number of producers and milk pooled on the three orders. Counties and states with fewer than three producers were combined with adjacent counties. The map on page 5 does not combine counties with fewer than three producers due to the use of size-ranges.

**Producer Milk By State**

**Arizona (and California)** - In May 2002, 108 producers and 283.3 million pounds of milk from Arizona (and California) were pooled on the Arizona-Las Vegas Order. There were fewer than three producers from California pooled on the Arizona-Las Vegas Order. The information is restricted and the producers pooled on the Arizona-Las Vegas Order were included with Arizona.

**Idaho** - On the Pacific Northwest Order, 28 producers and 8.7 million pounds from Idaho, or 1.3% of producer milk, were pooled. On the Western Order, 377 producers and 270.7 million pounds of milk from Idaho, or 55.7% of the producer milk, were pooled.

**Oregon** - In Oregon 173.5 million pounds of milk were pooled on the Pacific Northwest and Western Orders. On the Pacific Northwest Order, 297 producers and 170.1 million pounds from Oregon, or 24.6% of producer milk, were pooled. On the Western Order, 29 producers and 3.4 million pounds of milk from Oregon, or 0.7% of the producer milk, were pooled.

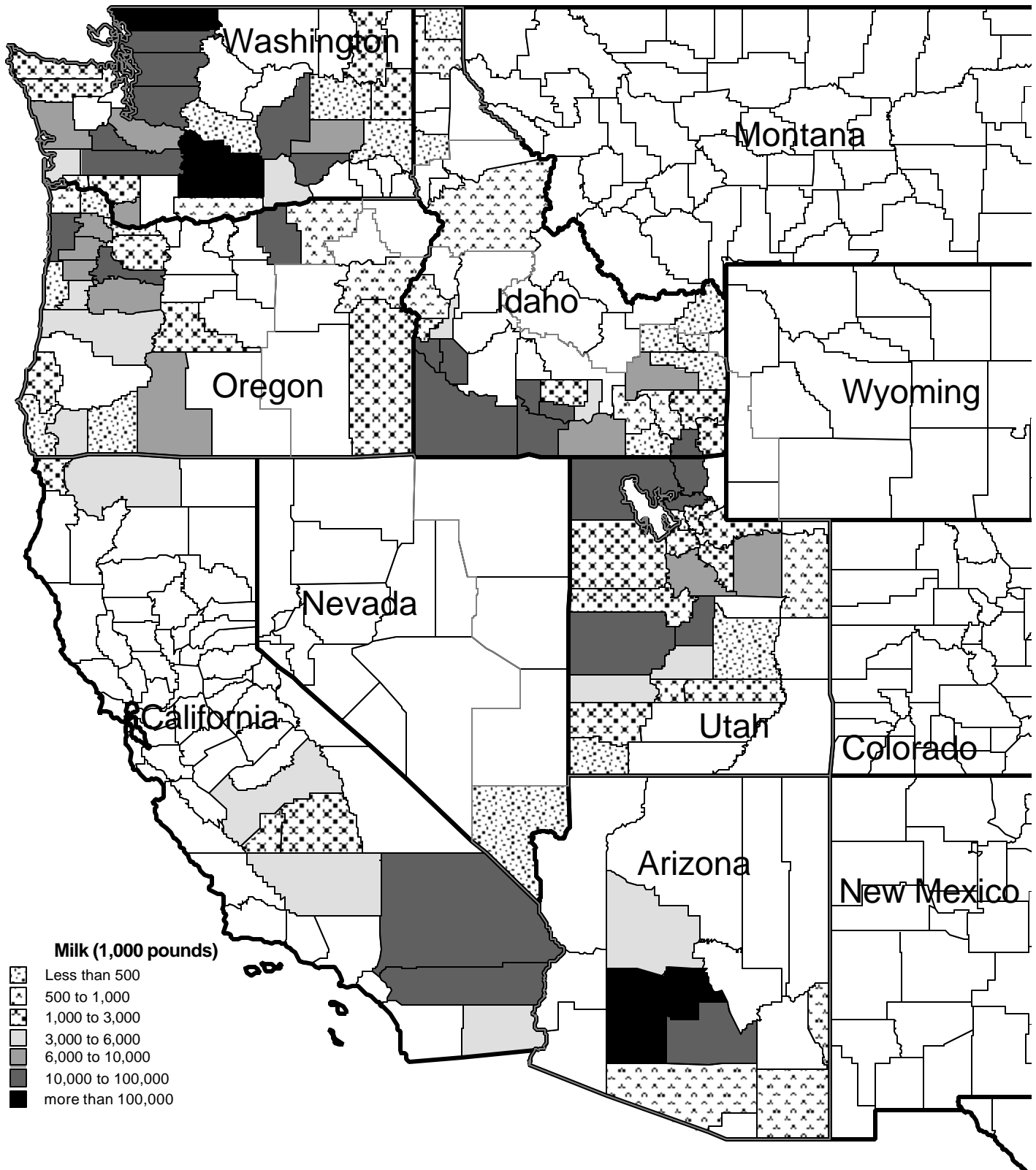
**Utah (and Nevada)** - In Utah 131.2 million pounds of milk were pooled on the Western and Pacific Northwest Orders. On the Western Order, 343 producers and 131.2 million pounds of milk from Utah, or 27.0% of producer milk, were pooled. On the Pacific Northwest Order, one producer was pooled, therefore the information is restricted. Producers and producer milk originating in Nevada was included with Utah on the Western Order for reasons of confidentiality.

**Washington** - In May 2002, 623 producers and 474.1 million pounds of milk from Washington were pooled on the Pacific Northwest Order. Washington producers represented 68.7% of all producer milk on the Pacific Northwest Order.

**California** - Producers located in California were pooled on the Pacific Northwest, Western, and the Arizona-Las Vegas Orders. On the Pacific Northwest Order, 23 producers and 37.3 million pounds from California, or 5.4% of producer milk, were pooled. On the Western Order, 43 producers and 80.6 million pounds of milk from California, or 16.6% of the producer milk, were pooled. There were fewer than three producers from California pooled on the Arizona-Las Vegas Order. The information is restricted and the producers pooled on the Arizona-Las Vegas Order were included with Arizona. ♦
