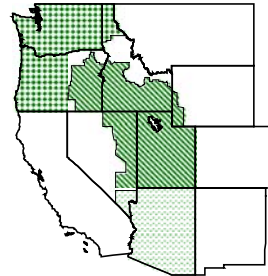

### MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JUNE 2003

Comparisons to a year ago can be found in the tables on pages 6 and 7.

#### Pacific Northwest

Producers delivered a total of 620.2 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 20.7 million pounds, down 0.2 percent from May. An estimated 903 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 22,893 pounds, down 0.2 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 160.4 million pounds, 25.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.3 million pounds, down 8.4 percent from May.

#### Arizona-Las Vegas

Producers delivered a total of 262.3 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 8.7 million pounds, down 4.2 percent from May. An estimated 106 producers delivered milk to

the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 82,486 pounds, down 4.2 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 72.4 million pounds, 27.6 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 2.4 million pounds, down 8.5 percent from May.

#### Western

Producers delivered a total of 605.3 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 20.2 million pounds, down 2.2 percent from May. An estimated 858 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 23,516 pounds, down 1.6 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 86.8 million pounds, 14.3 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 2.9 million pounds, down 4.6 percent from May. ♦

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**JUNE 2003 CLASS PRICES**

June 2003 non-advanced Class Prices were calculated using NASS commodity price surveys from May 31, June 7, 14, 21, and 28, 2003. Component prices for the month are \$1.9434 per pound of protein, \$1.1576 per pound of butterfat, negative \$0.0200 per pound of other solids, and \$0.6574 per pound of nonfat solids. The other solids price is negative because the average wholesale price of dry whey for June 2003 is less than the make allowance contained in the other solids price formula.

June 2003 Class III and IV prices at 3.5% butterfat are \$9.75 and \$9.76 per hundredweight, respectively. The June Class III price compared to May is up \$0.04. The Class III price is \$0.34 lower than June 2002. The Class III price at 3.67% butterfat is \$0.04 above the support price of \$9.90 at 3.67% butterfat.

Class II butterfat was announced at \$1.1646 per pound. Class I skim and butterfat and Class II skim prices for June 2003 were announced on May 23, 2003. The Class II price at 3.5% butterfat is \$10.46 for June 2003 .

**Current Commodity Prices** -- The NASS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed an increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net increase of 14.38 cents between the June 14 and the July 12 surveys, to \$1.2846 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (**adjusted to 38% moisture**) showed an increase of 20.35 cents to \$1.3190 per pound.

The NASS butter price showed a net increase of 4.89 cents between the weeks ending June 14 and July 12 from \$1.0761 per pound to \$1.1250 per pound.

The NASS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 0.29 cents since mid-June to \$0.8060 per pound. The average price for NASS whey showed an increase of 0.95 cents since mid-June to \$0.1463 per pound. ♦

**AUGUST'S CLASS I PRICE ANNOUNCEMENT**

On July 18, the August 2003 Class I price was announced at \$12.87 for the Pacific Northwest and Western Orders, and \$13.32 for the Arizona-Las Vegas Order. The Class I price was calculated using NASS commodity price surveys from the weeks of July 5 and 12.

The August Class III and IV advance skim prices are \$7.07 and \$5.94 per hundredweight, respectively. The butterfat portion of the Class I mover increased 2.64 cents from \$1.1590 to \$1.1854 per pound.

The August 2003 Class II skim and nonfat solids prices were also announced on July 18. The skim price is \$6.64 per hundredweight, and the nonfat solids price is \$0.7378 per pound for all Federal orders. ♦

**PROPOSALS TO AMEND THE PRODUCER-HANDLER PROVISIONS OF THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST MARKETING ORDER**

In response to an invitation to submit proposals issued for the Arizona - Las Vegas order, Darigold Farms d/b/a/ Northwest Dairy Association (NDA) has requested that the Department of Agriculture (USDA) hold an emergency public hearing to consider a proposal to amend the Pacific Northwest milk order.

The proponents propose to amend the producer-handler provisions of the order to regulate any producer-handler whose route disposition within the Pacific Northwest marketing area exceeds three million pounds per month. In addition, the proposal seeks to amend other provisions related to producer-handlers.

This proposal has not yet been approved for inclusion in a Notice of Hearing. Before deciding whether a hearing should be held, USDA is providing interested parties this opportunity to submit additional proposals regarding the producer-handler provisions of the Pacific Northwest order. Additional proposals were due July 15, 2003.

**USDA AMENDS UPPER MIDWEST MILK MARKETING ORDER**

On June 23, 2003, the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced a final decision amending the Upper Midwest Federal Milk Marketing order. Under the decision, provisions that were previously implemented on an interim basis will be made permanent.

This final decision continues to prohibit the ability to simultaneously pool milk on the Upper Midwest Federal milk order and on a State-operated milk order that has marketwide pooling. It also continues to limit the amount of milk that can be diverted to nonpool plants from pool distributing plants regulated under the order.

This decision requires determining producer approval. USDA will conduct a vote on the amended order. If producers approve, a final rule will follow to implement these changes on a permanent basis.

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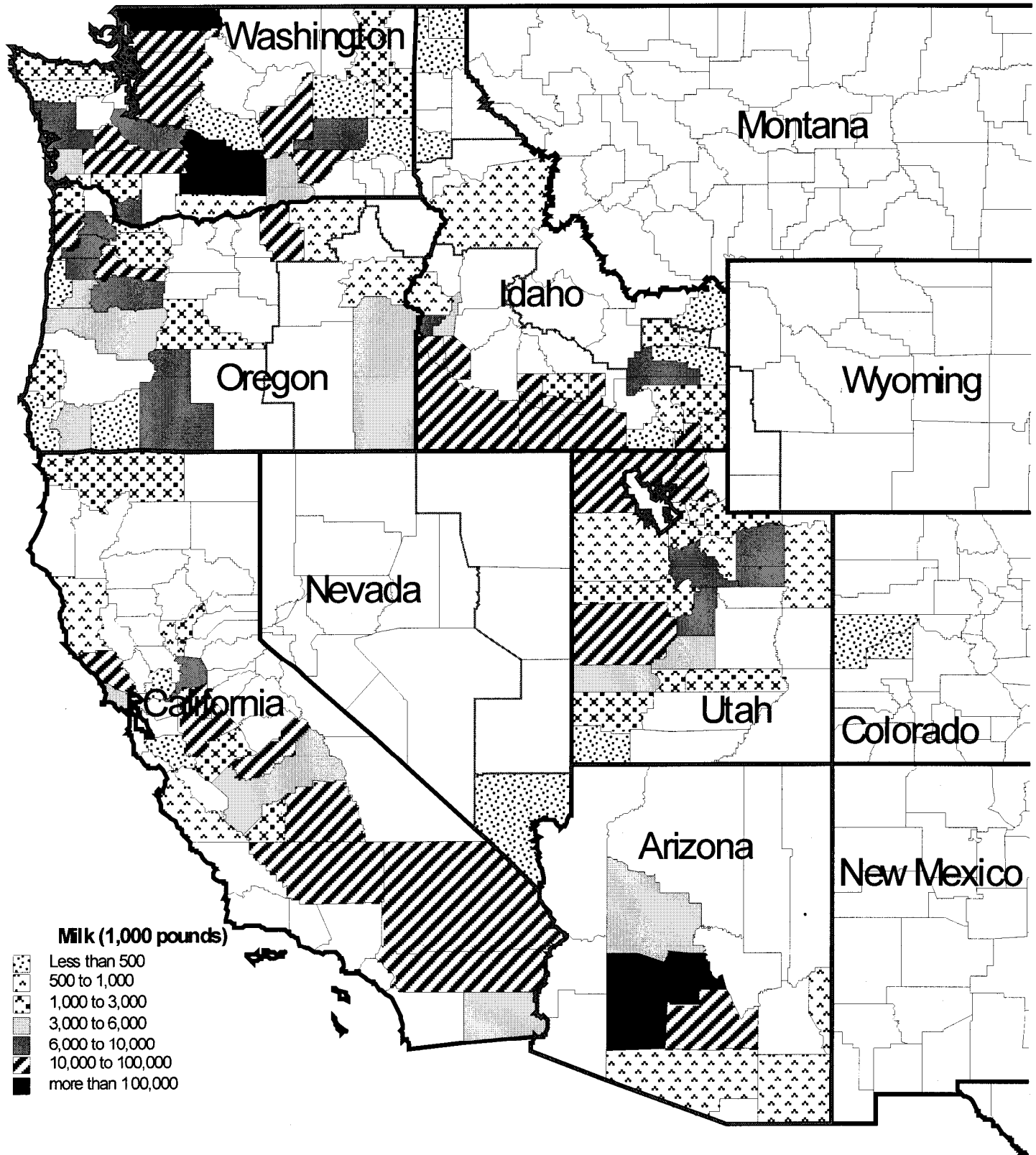

**PRODUCERS AND PRODUCER MILK BY ORDER, STATE, AND COUNTY, MAY 2003**

During the month of May 2003, a total of 1,873 producers, on a combined basis, were associated with the Pacific Northwest, Western, and Arizona-Las Vegas Orders. These producers delivered a total of 1,561.1 million pounds of milk to the markets during the month. The tables on pages 3 and 4 contain the number of producers and milk pooled on the three orders. Counties and states with fewer than three producers were combined with adjacent counties. The map on page 5 does not combine counties with fewer than three producers due to the use of size-ranges.
