MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JUNE

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 460.9 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 15.4 million pounds, down 20.7 percent from May. An estimated 442 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 34,758 pounds, down 16.3 percent from May.


Class I producer milk during June totaled 159.4 million pounds, 34.6 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.3 million pounds, up 1.0 percent from May. ▼

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 396.9 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 13.2 million pounds, down 4.9 percent from May. An estimated 95 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 139,279 pounds, down 4.9 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 105.0 million pounds, 26.4 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.5 million pounds, up 1.6 percent from May. ▼

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net decrease in prices received for 40-pound blocks and for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net decrease of 1.98 cents between the June 13 and the July 18 surveys, to \$1.6761 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a net decrease of 4.88 cents to \$1.6559 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net decrease of 0.63 cents between the weeks ending June 13 and July 18 from \$1.9364 per pound to \$1.9301 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net decrease of 7.68 cents since mid-June to \$0.8472 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a decrease of 4.27 cents since mid-June to \$0.3894 per pound. 

Farm Service Agency News

2016 MARGIN PROTECTION PROGRAM ENROLLMENT

On June 29, 2015, Agriculture Deputy Secretary Krysta Harden announced that starting July 1, 2015, dairy farmers can enroll in the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Margin Protection Program for coverage in 2016. The voluntary program, established by the 2014 Farm Bill, provides financial assistance to participating dairy operations when the margin - the difference between the price of milk and feed costs - falls below the coverage level selected by the farmer.

"More than half of our nation's dairy producers enrolled in the 2015 program, which exceeded our expectations for the first year of the program," said Harden. "We are confident that dairy farmers across the country will again take advantage of this safety net program for 2016. USDA will continue outreach efforts, including partnering with cooperative extension services, to ensure dairy producers are fully informed about the protections that this safety net program can provide during periods of market downturns."

The Margin Protection Program gives participating dairy producers the flexibility to select coverage levels best suited for their operation. Enrollment begins July 1 and ends on September 30, 2015, for coverage in 2016. Participating farmers will remain in the program through 2018 and pay a \$100 administrative fee each year. Producers also have the option of selecting a different coverage level during open enrollment each year. Margin Protection Program payments are based on an operation's historical production. An operation's historical production will increase by 2.61 percent in 2016 if the operation participated in 2015, providing a stronger safety net.

USDA also has an online resource available to help dairy producers decide which level of coverage will provide them with the strongest safety net under a variety of conditions. The enhanced Web tool, available at www.fsa.usda.gov/mpptool, allows dairy farmers to quickly and easily combine their unique operation data and other key variables to calculate their coverage needs based on price projections. Producers can also review historical data or estimate future coverage based on data projections. The secure site can be accessed via computer, mobile phone, or tablet, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Dairy operations enrolling in the program must meet conservation compliance provisions. Producers participating in the Livestock Gross Margin insurance program may register for the Margin Protection Program, but this new margin program will only begin once their Livestock dairy insurance coverage has ended. Producers must also submit form CCC-782 for 2016, confirming their Margin Protection Program coverage level selection, to the local Farm Service Agency (FSA) office. If electing higher coverage for 2016, dairy producers can either pay the premium in full at the time of enrollment or pay a minimum of 25 percent of the premium by February 1, 2016.


The Margin Protection Program was established by the 2014 Farm Bill, which builds on historic economic gains in rural America over the past six years, while achieving meaningful reform and billions of dollars in savings for the taxpayer. Since enactment, USDA has made significant progress to implement each provision of this critical legislation, including providing disaster relief to farmers and ranchers; strengthening risk management tools; expanding access to rural credit; funding critical research; establishing innovative public-private conservation partnerships; developing new markets for rural-made products; and investing in infrastructure, housing and community facilities to help improve quality of life in rural America. 
**Pacific Northwest (FO 124) and Arizona (FO 131) Producer Milk Pooled
