MARKET SUMMARIES FOR SEPTEMBER

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)


Producers delivered a total of 602.3 million pounds of milk to the market during September. Daily deliveries averaged 20.1 million pounds, down 3.6 percent from August. An estimated 483 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 41,565 pounds, down 3.6 percent from August.

Class I producer milk during September totaled 174.2 million pounds, 28.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 5.8 million pounds, down 0.02 percent from August.

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 331.8 million pounds of milk to the market during September. Daily deliveries averaged 11.1 million pounds, down 4.9 percent from August. An estimated 92 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 120,213 pounds, down 4.9 percent from August.

Class I producer milk during September totaled 110.9 million pounds, 33.4 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.7 million pounds, down 1.1 percent from August.

USDA Updates

USDA ANNOUNCES CANCELLATION AND POSTPONEMENT OF SELECTED REPORTS IMPACTED BY THE LAPSE IN FEDERAL FUNDING

On October 17, 2013, The U.S. Department of Agriculture announced that the National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) and World Agricultural Outlook Board (WAOB) have cancelled or postponed publication of selected USDA statistical reports impacted by the lapse in federal funding.

NASS's Crop Production and Cotton Ginnings reports and the WAOB's World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) scheduled for October 11th are canceled. The next scheduled release for these reports is November 8, 2013. Additionally, NASS's Crop Progress reports scheduled for October 7th and 15th are cancelled. NASS's Cattle on Feed and Peanut Prices reports scheduled for October 18th are postponed.

While the lapse in federal funding has ended, NASS has not been able to engage in the necessary data collection and analysis over the past few weeks. NASS is assessing its data collection plans and evaluating the timing of upcoming reports.

In a separate news release that same day, NASS announced an updated schedule for all reports originally scheduled for release in October. The Dairy Products report was moved from October 3rd to October 21st. The Milk Production report has been rescheduled from October 21st to November 1st. Both the Agriculture Prices and Cold Storage reports will be released on October 31st. 




Selected Prices: 2000 - Present

Federal Order Butterfat, Protein, Nonfat Solids, and Other Solids Prices January 2000 through August 2013




Federal Order Class III and IV Prices @ 3.5% Butterfat January 2000 through August 2013




USDA Monthly Butter, Weighted Average Cheese, Nonfat Dry Milk, and Whey January 2012 through August 2013
