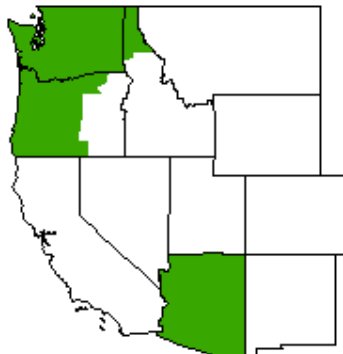

MARKET SUMMARIES FOR NOVEMBER 2006

Comparisons to a year ago can be found in the tables on pages 6 and 7.

Pacific Northwest

Producers delivered a total of 596.9 million pounds of milk to the market during November. Daily deliveries averaged 19.9 million pounds, down 0.6 percent from October. An estimated 769 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 25,874 pounds, down 0.6 percent from October.

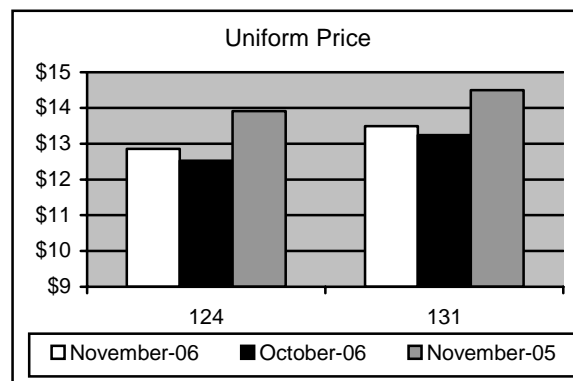
Class I producer milk during November totaled 198.1 million pounds, 33.2 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 6.6 million pounds, up 3.6 percent from October.

Arizona

Producers delivered a total of 276.9 million pounds of milk to the market during November. Daily deliveries averaged 9.2 million pounds, up 4.5 percent from October. An estimated 94 producers

delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 98,183 pounds, up 4.5 percent from October.

Class I producer milk during November totaled 117.4 million pounds, 42.4 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.9 million pounds, up 4.4 percent from October. ♦

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NOVEMBER 2006 CLASS PRICES

November 2006 non-advanced Class Prices were calculated using NASS commodity price surveys from November 4, 11, 18, and 25, 2006. Component prices for the month are \$2.2383 per pound of protein, \$1.3852 per pound of butterfat, \$0.2276 per pound of other solids, and \$0.8353 per pound of nonfat solids.

November 2006 Class III and IV prices at 3.5% butterfat are \$12.84 and \$12.11 per hundredweight, respectively. The November Class III price compared to October is up \$0.52. The Class III price is \$1.51 lower than November 2005. The Class III price at 3.67% butterfat is \$3.16 above the support price of \$9.90 at 3.67% butterfat.

Class II butterfat was announced at \$1.3922 per pound. Class I skim and butterfat and Class II skim prices for November 2006 were announced on October 20, 2006. The Class II price at 3.5% butterfat is \$11.98 for November 2006.

Current Commodity Prices -- The NASS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net increase in price received for 40-pound blocks and a net decrease for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net increase of 5.31 cents between the November 18 and the December 16 surveys, to \$1.3384 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (**adjusted to 38% moisture**) showed a net decrease of 0.87 cent to \$1.3247 per pound.

The NASS butter price showed a decrease of 4.35 cents between the weeks ending November 18 and December 16 from \$1.2853 per pound to \$1.2418 per pound.

The NASS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 1.63 cents since mid-November to \$1.0160 per pound. The average price for NASS whey showed a net increase of 1.44 cents since mid-November to \$0.4101 per pound. ♦

JANUARY'S CLASS I PRICE ANNOUNCEMENT

On December 22, the January 2007 Class I price was announced at \$15.49 for the Pacific Northwest Order and \$15.94 for the Arizona Order. The Class I price was calculated using NASS commodity price surveys from the weeks of December 9 and 16.

The January Class III and IV advance skim prices are \$9.17 and \$7.87 per hundredweight, respectively. The butterfat portion of the Class I mover decreased 2.23 cents from \$1.3770 to \$1.3547 per pound.

The January 2007 Class II skim and nonfat solids prices were also announced on December 22. The skim price is \$8.57 per hundredweight, and the nonfat solids price is \$0.9522 per pound for all Federal orders. ♦

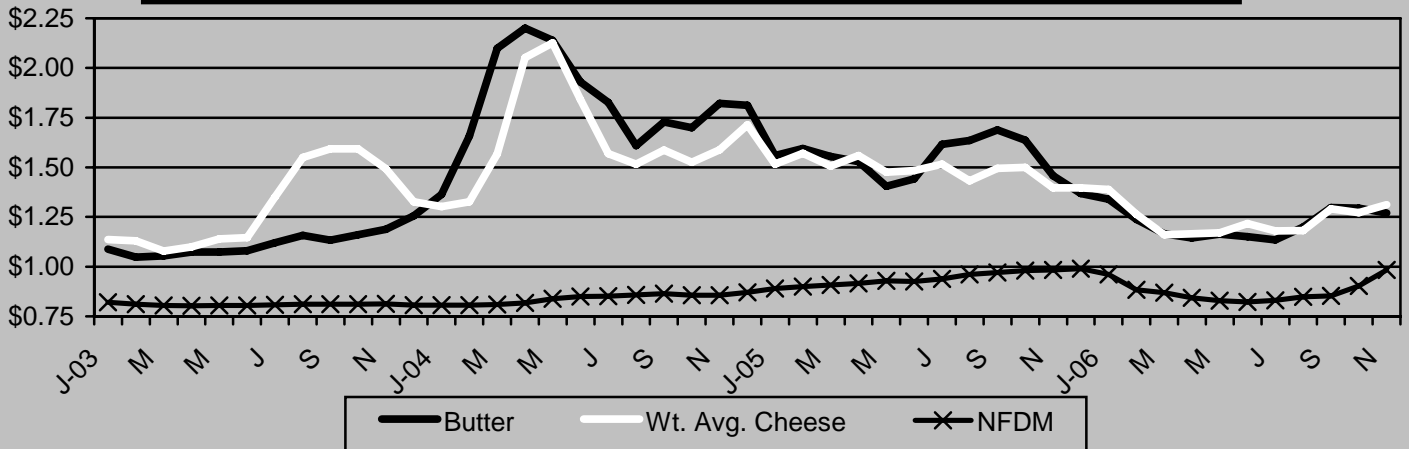

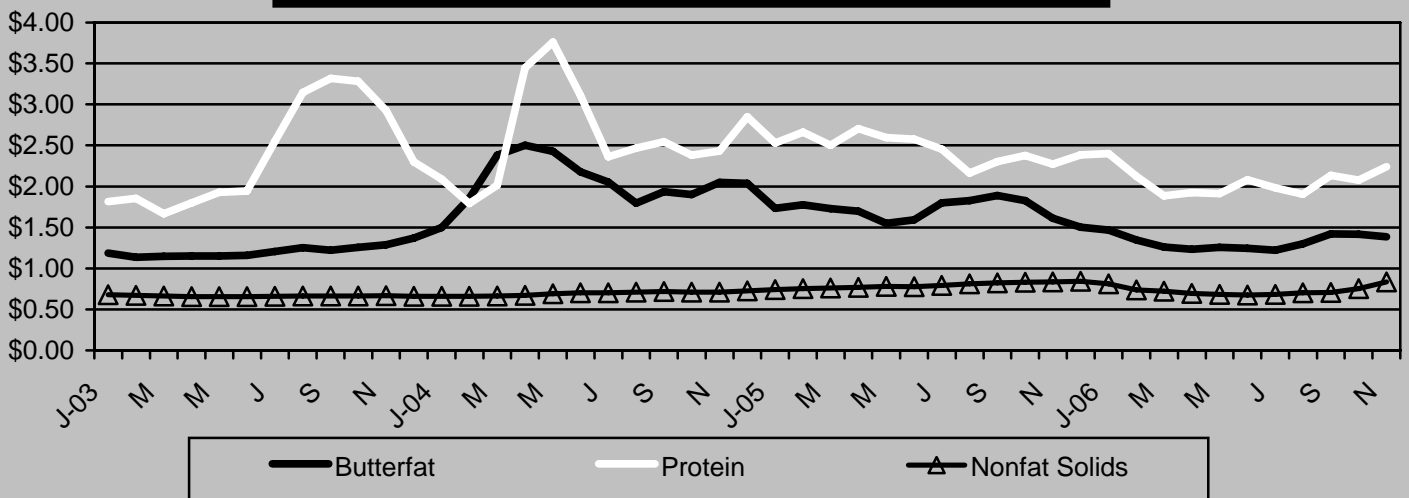
PRICE SERIES AVAILABLE ON USDA'S DAIRY PROGRAMS WEBSITE

The Market Information Branch (MIB) of USDA's Dairy Programs recently added a new section to the price information on its Milk Marketing Order Statistics (MMOS) website; the new section contains various Over-Order Prices Reports. Three over-order price data series are reported: Announced Cooperative Class I Prices; Mailbox Prices; and the new Over-Order Prices. There is a general description of over-order prices, and for each of the three data series, the following is carried: a description, current information, and historical information. 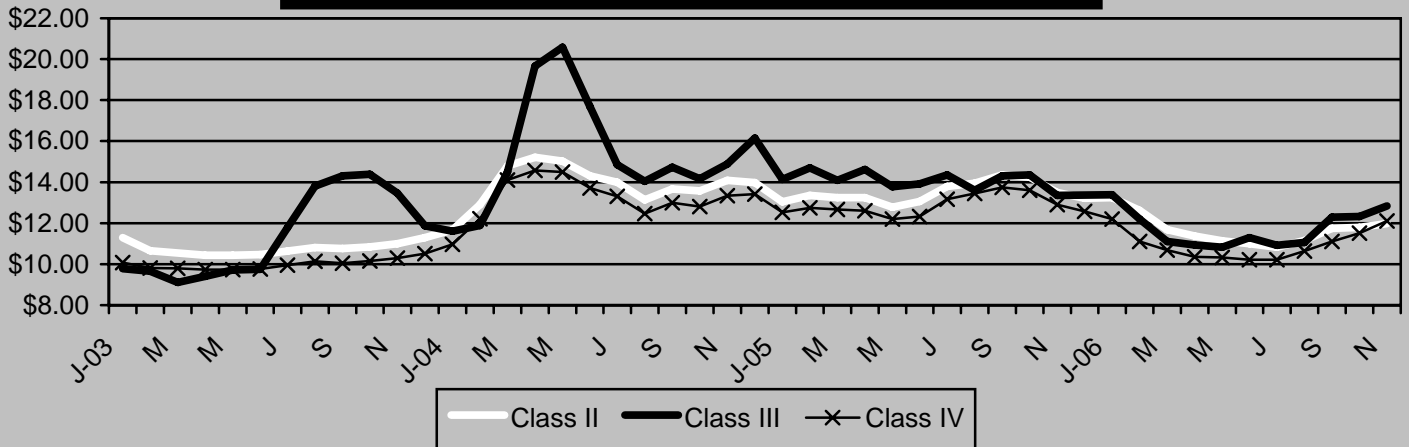
**NASS Monthly Butter, Weighted Average Cheese, and Nonfat Dry Milk Prices

**USDA ISSUES A TENTATIVE FINAL DECISION
ON AMENDMENTS TO ALL FEDERAL MILK
MARKETING ORDERS**

On November 20, 2006, the U. S. Department of Agriculture issued a tentative final decision to amend the manufacturing (make) allowances contained in the Class III and Class IV product price formulas in all Federal milk marketing orders. The decision was based on the record of the first session of an emergency public hearing held in Alexandria, Virginia, on January 24-27, 2006, and a second session held in Strongsville, Ohio, on September 14-15, 2006.

The decision amends the manufacturing (make) allowances for cheese, butter, nonfat dry milk (NFD) and dry whey. Specifically, this decision adopts the following increased manufacturing allowances: cheese -- \$0.1682 per pound; butter -- \$0.1202 per pound; NFD -- \$.1570 per pound; and dry whey -- \$0.1956 per pound. These amendments are subject to producer approval before they can be implemented.

The tentative final decision was published in the November 22 Federal Register. Public comments are due 60 days after publication in the Federal Register, on January 22, 2007.

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**USDA SETS HEARING ON PROPOSED
AMENDMENTS TO ALL FEDERAL MILK
ORDERS**

On November 20, 2006, the U. S. Department of Agriculture announced that it would hold a national public hearing to consider proposals seeking to amend the Class I and Class II milk price formulas applicable to all Federal milk marketing orders. Evidence was taken at the hearing to determine whether emergency marketing conditions exist that would warrant omission of a recommended decision. The hearing was held December 11, 2006, in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

The hearing was requested by National Milk Producers Federation to reconsider formulas for Class I and Class II milk.

The hearing notice was published in the November 22 Federal Register. USDA HOLDS FEDERAL MILK ORDER PRE-HEARING INFORMATION SESSION

The U.S. Department of Agriculture held a public information session December 5, 2006, to address proposals received to amend the Federal order Class III and Class IV product price formulas. The purpose of the session was for interested parties to learn about the intent of proposals that have been submitted to amend Class III and Class IV product price formulas. The session enabled proponents to better prepare testimony and evidence in support of, or in opposition to proposals that may possibly be included in a future Class III and IV hearing notice. The session will not become part of an official hearing record and was conducted outside of ex-parte rules. This allowed government officials to freely discuss proposed amendments. 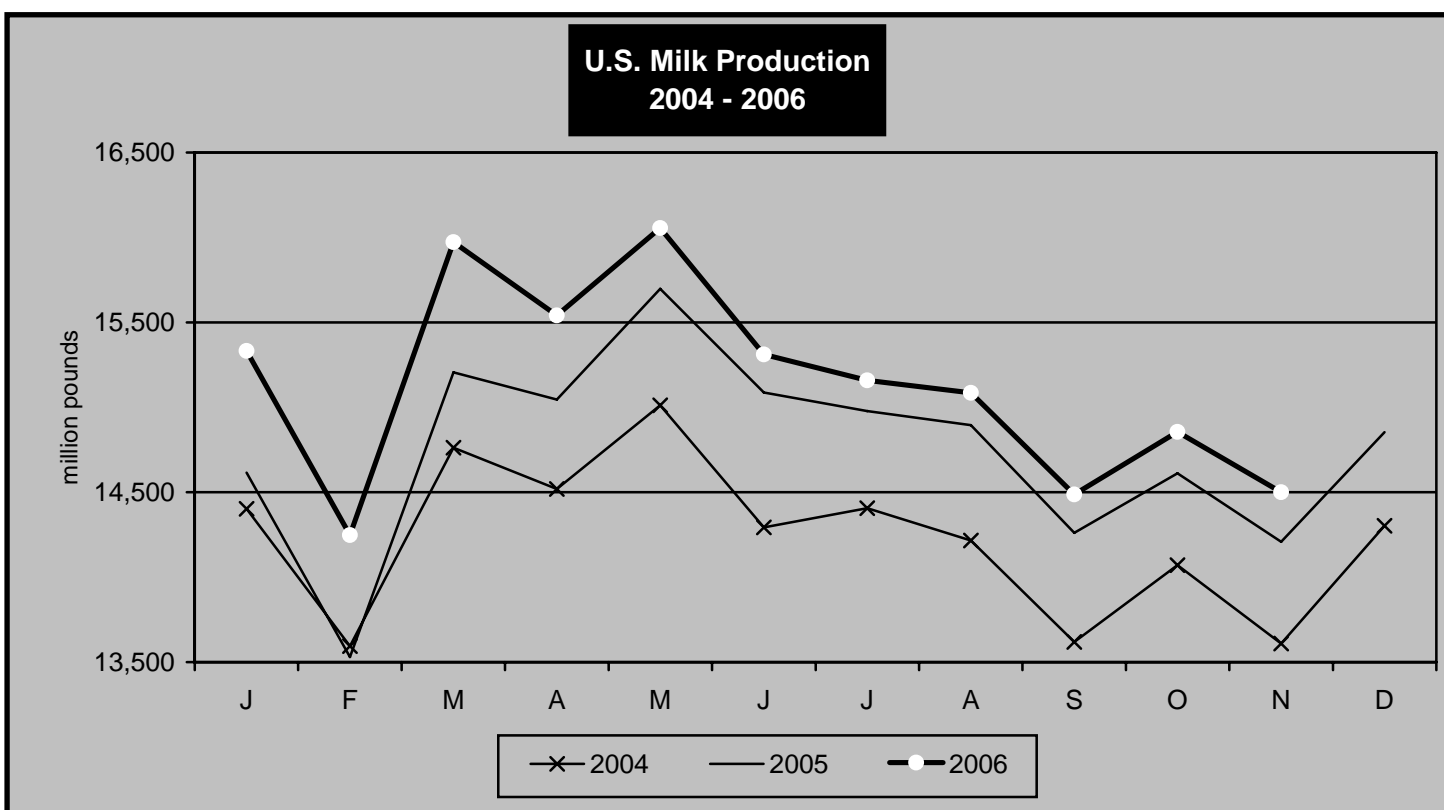
UNITED STATES MILK PRODUCTION UP 2.0 PERCENT IN NOVEMBER 2006

Milk production for November 2006 was up 2.0 percent for the United States compared with November 2005. United States' milk production for November 2006 equaled 14,500 million pounds, 291 million pounds more than last November. The
