### MARKET SUMMARIES FOR OCTOBER

#### Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 615.7 million pounds of milk to the market during October. Daily deliveries averaged 19.9 million pounds, down 1.9 percent from September. An estimated 356 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 55,788 pounds, down 1.9 percent from September.

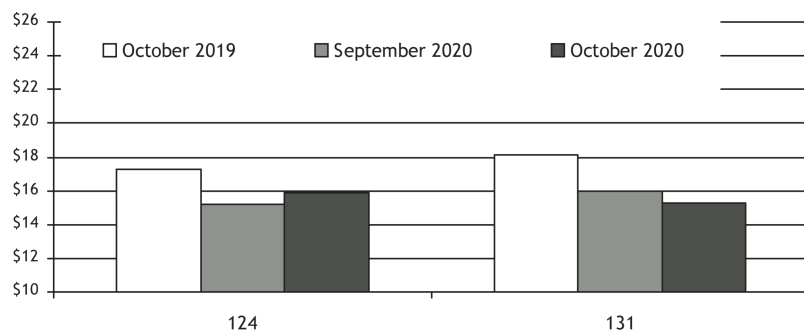
Class I producer milk during October totaled 144.3 million pounds, 23.4 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.7 million pounds, up 2.1 percent from September. ▼

#### Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 302.0 million pounds of milk to the market during October. Daily deliveries averaged 9.7 million pounds, up 10.0 percent from September. An estimated 69 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 141,204 pounds, up 10.0 percent from September.

Class I producer milk during October totaled 108.4 million pounds, 35.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.5 million pounds, up 4.4 percent from September. ▼

## CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and an increase for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net increase of 12.42 cents between the October 17 and the November 14 surveys, to \$2.7365 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed an increase of 54.32 cents to \$2.4943 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net decrease of 1.32 cents between the weeks ending October 17 and the November 14 from \$1.5049 per pound to \$1.4917 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 1.04 cents since mid-October to \$1.0836 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed an increase of 3.44 cents since mid-October to \$0.3802 per pound. 🐄

## USDA News

### USDA'S CORONAVIRUS FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM 2 DEADLINE

The USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) would like to remind farmers and ranchers that the deadline to apply for the Coronavirus Food Assistance Program 2 (CFAP 2) is December 11, 2020. This program provides direct relief to producers who continue to face market disruptions and associated costs because of COVID-19.

CFAP 2 will provide up to \$14 billion to eligible producers of certain row crops, livestock, dairy, specialty crops, aquaculture and more. All eligible commodities, payment rates and calculations can be found on [farmers.gov/cfap](https://farmers.gov/cfap). CFAP 2 is a separate program from the first iteration of the program (CFAP 1) and interested producers must complete a new application to be eligible for payment for CFAP 2.

Customers seeking one-on-one support with the CFAP 2 application process can call 877-508-8364 to speak directly with a USDA employee ready to offer general assistance. This is a recommended first step before a producer engages the team at the FSA county office.
