MARKET SUMMARIES FOR SEPTEMBER

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 610.8 million pounds of milk to the market during September. Daily deliveries averaged 20.4 million pounds, up 2.0 percent from August. An estimated 303 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 67,197 pounds, up 2.0 percent from August.

Class I producer milk during September totaled 140.0 million pounds, 22.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.7 million pounds, up 7.7 percent from August. ▼

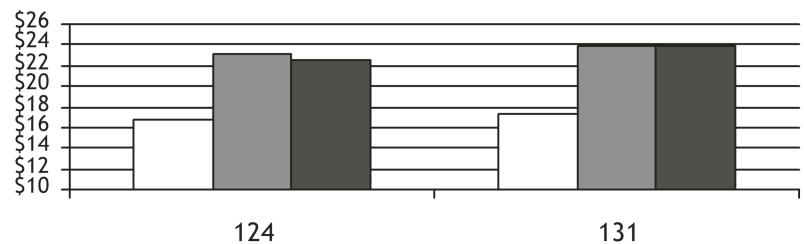
Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 360.6 million pounds of milk to the market during September. Daily deliveries averaged 12.0 million pounds, up 14.8 percent from August. An estimated 67 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 179,389 pounds, up 14.8 percent from August.

Class I producer milk during September totaled 111.5 million pounds, 30.9 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.7 million pounds, up 13.7 percent from August. ▼

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed an increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and an increase for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed an increase of 21.24 cents between the September 17 and the October 15 surveys, to \$2.0306 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed an increase of 30.95 cents to \$2.2414 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net increase of 8.79 cents between the weeks ending September 17 and October 15 from \$3.1419 per pound to \$3.2298 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net decrease of 0.25 cents since mid-September to \$1.5862 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net decrease of 48.46 cents since mid-September to \$0.4846 per pound. 🍌

USDA ANNOUNCES ITS LOCAL FOOD PURCHASE ASSISTANCE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT WITH OREGON

The following is an excerpt from the USDA website: The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) announced, on October 18, 2022, it has signed a cooperative agreement with Oregon under the Local Food Purchase Assistance Cooperative Agreement Program (LFPA). Through LFPA, the Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS) will purchase and distribute locally grown, produced, and processed food from underserved producers.

"USDA is excited to partner with Oregon to promote economic opportunities for farmers and producers and to increase access to locally sourced, fresh, healthy, and nutritious food in underserved communities," said USDA Under Secretary for Marketing and Regulatory Programs Jenny Lester Moffitt. "The Local Food Purchase Cooperative Agreement Program will improve food and agricultural supply-chain resiliency and increase local food consumption around the country."

Through the LFPA program, ODHS will work with Oregon Food Bank (OFB) to improve supply chain resiliency by providing funds to growers, ranchers, seafood harvesters, food distribution organizations, and processors who will then distribute products to their local and regional communities.

USDA's Local Food Purchase Assistance Cooperative Agreement Program provides up to \$900 million through non-competitive cooperative agreements to enable state, territory and tribal governments to support local, regional and underserved producers, and maintain or improve food and agricultural supply chain resiliency through the purchase of food produced within the state or within 400 miles of delivery destination. Funding for the program comes from the American Rescue Plan and the Commodity Credit Corporation.
