### MARKET SUMMARIES FOR FEBRUARY

#### Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 655.5 million pounds of milk to the market during February. Daily deliveries averaged 23.4 million pounds, up 2.3 percent from January. An estimated 378 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 61,929 pounds, up 2.3 percent from January.


Class I producer milk during February totaled 124.3 million pounds, 19.0 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.4 million pounds, down 4.4 percent from January.


#### Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 416.7 million pounds of milk to the market during February. Daily deliveries averaged 14.9 million pounds, up 3.5 percent from January. An estimated 67 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 222,122 pounds, up 3.5 percent from January.

Class I producer milk during February totaled 112.3 million pounds, 27.0 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.0 million pounds, up 3.0 percent from January.

#### **CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES**

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net decrease in prices received for 40-pound blocks and a net increase for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net decrease of 1.20 cents between the February 18 and the March 18 surveys, to \$1.9411 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a net increase of 4.15 cents to \$1.6855 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net decrease of 3.22 cents between the weeks ending February 18 and March 18 from \$2.4378 per pound to \$2.4056 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net decrease of 2.31 cents since mid-February to \$1.2249 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net increase of 2.05 cents since mid-February to \$0.4195 per pound.

# USDA SEEKING NATIONAL DAIRY PROMOTION AND RESEARCH BOARD NOMINEES

On March 22, the USDA announced the Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) is seeking nominees for the National Dairy Promotion and Research Board. The deadline for nominations is April 28, 2023.

From the nominees, the Secretary of Agriculture will appoint twelve individuals to succeed members whose terms expire on October 31, 2023. Newly appointed members will serve three-year terms from November 1, 2023, through October 31, 2026. The Secretary of Agriculture will also appoint one individual to fill a vacancy, with the term ending October 31, 2024.

The USDA is seeking nominees for: One seat for Region 1 (Alaska, Oregon and Washington); One seat for Region 2 (California and Hawaii) (Vacant seat); One seat for Region 3 (Arizona, Colorado, Montana, Nevada, Utah and Wyoming); Two seats for Region 4 (Arkansas, Kansas, New Mexico, Oklahoma and Texas); One seat for Region 5 (Minnesota, North Dakota and South Dakota); Two seats for Region 6 (Wisconsin); One seat for Region 7 (Illinois, Iowa, Missouri and Nebraska); One seat for Region 8 (Idaho); One seat for Region 9 (Indiana, Michigan, Ohio and West Virginia); One seat for Region 10 (Alabama, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia); One seat for Region 12 (Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, Rhode Island and Vermont); One seat for an Importer.

Nominees must be dairy producers in the region for which they are nominated. The 37-member board consists of 36 dairy producers from 12 regions and one dairy importer.
