# MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JUNE

#### Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 602.9 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 20.1 million pounds, down 15.4 percent from May. An estimated 295 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 68,126 pounds, up 3.0 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 123.5 million pounds, 20.5 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.1 million pounds, down 6.7 percent from May.


#### Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 445.2 million pounds of milk to the market during June. Daily deliveries averaged 14.8 million pounds, up 7.5 percent from May. An estimated 61 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 243,261 pounds, up 7.5 percent from May.

Class I producer milk during June totaled 108.4 million pounds, 24.3 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.6 million pounds, up 1.4 percent from May.

#### **CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES**

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a decrease in prices received for 40-pound blocks and a net decrease for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a decrease of 11.67 cents between the June 17 and the July 15 surveys, to \$1.4124 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a net decrease of 14.65 cent to \$1.4327 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net increase of 0.84 cents between the weeks ending June 17 and July 15 from \$2.4347 per pound to \$2.4431 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net decrease of 0.54 cents since mid-June to \$1.1674 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a decrease of 5.80 cents since mid-June to \$0.2616 per pound.

### **USDA News**

#### USDA SETS HEARING ON PROPOSED PRICING AMENDMENTS FOR FEDERAL ORDERS

On July 24, 2023, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced they will hold a public hearing beginning Wednesday, August 23, 2023, to consider proposals seeking to amend the uniform pricing formulas applicable in all 11 Federal milk marketing orders (FMMOs). The hearing will begin at 9:00 a.m. ET at the 502 East Event Centre, 502 East Carmel Drive, Carmel, Indiana, 46032.

Proponents contend that the uniform FMMO pricing formulas should be amended, as significant changes in the dairy industry and milk marketing have occurred since their adoption in the early 2000s. Forty proposals were submitted by stakeholders for consideration. Of those, 21 directly impact the uniform pricing formulas and will be considered at the hearing. The proposals contained in the hearing notice seek to amend the milk composition factors, commodity product prices, Class III and Class IV formula factors, base Class I skim milk, and Class I and Class II differentials.

The hearing notice was published in the Federal Register on July 24, 2023. 
