MARKET SUMMARIES FOR DECEMBER

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 607.1 million pounds of milk to the market during December. Daily deliveries averaged 19.6 million pounds, up 0.9 percent from November. An estimated 260 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 75,324 pounds, up 0.9 percent from November.

Class I producer milk during December totaled 129.3 million pounds, 21.3 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.2 million pounds, down 7.4 percent from November. *****

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 448.2 million pounds of milk to the market during December. Daily deliveries averaged 14.5 million pounds, up 2.3 percent from November. An estimated 64 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 225,911 pounds, up 2.3 percent from November.

Class I producer milk during December totaled 119.4 million pounds, 26.7 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.9 million pounds, up 9.4 percent from November. **T**

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net decrease in prices received for 40-pound blocks and a decrease for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net decrease of 12.51 cents between the December 16 and the January 13 surveys, to \$1.5098 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a decrease of 10.56 cents to \$1.4807 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net decrease of 4.57 cents between the weeks ending December 16 and January 13 from \$2.6904 per pound to \$2.6447 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 0.73 cents since mid-December to \$1.2071 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net increase of 1.21 cents since mid-December to \$0.4309 per pound. **T**






