# MARKET SUMMARIES FOR MARCH

#### Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 620.7 million pounds of milk to the market during March. Daily deliveries averaged 20.0 million pounds, up 0.8 percent from February. An estimated 259 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 77,311 pounds, up 0.8 percent from February.

Class I producer milk during March totaled 124.3 million pounds, 20.0 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.0 million pounds, down 5.6 percent from February.

### Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 414.0 million pounds of milk to the market during March. Daily deliveries averaged 13.4 million pounds, down 2.1 percent from February. An estimated 63 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 211,962 pounds, down 2.1 percent from February.

Class I producer milk during March totaled 112.7 million pounds, 27.2 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.6 million pounds, down 6.4 percent from February.

#### **CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES**

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net decrease in prices received for 40-pound blocks and a net decrease for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net decrease of 10.82 cents between the March 16 and the April 13 surveys, to \$1.4899 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a net decrease of 13.65 cents to \$1.5143 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net increase of 4.69 cents between the weeks ending March 16 and April 13 from \$2.8648 per pound to \$2.9117 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net decrease of 2.37 cents since mid-March to \$1.1746 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a decrease of 4.30 cents since mid-March to \$0.4425 per pound.
