MARKET SUMMARIES FOR APRIL

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 611.3 million pounds of milk to the market during April. Daily deliveries averaged 20.4 million pounds, up 1.8 percent from March. An estimated 251 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 81,189 pounds, up 1.8 percent from March.

Class I producer milk during April totaled 128.9 million pounds, 21.1 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.3 million pounds, up 7.1 percent from March. 🍷

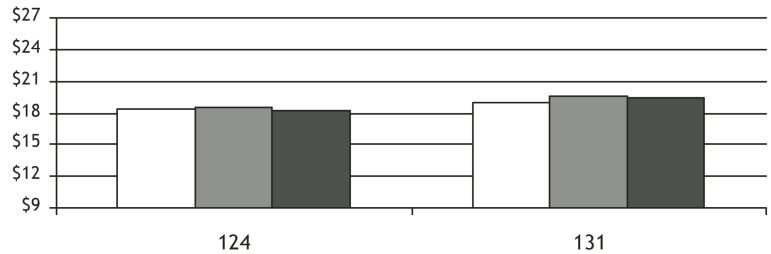
Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 386.7 million pounds of milk to the market during April. Daily deliveries averaged 12.9 million pounds, down 3.5 percent from March. An estimated 62 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 207,900 pounds, down 3.5 percent from March.

Class I producer milk during April totaled 133.2 million pounds, 34.5 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.4 million pounds, up 22.1 percent from March. 🍷

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed an increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and an increase for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed an increase of 33.04 cents between the April 13 and the May 18 surveys, to \$1.8160 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed an increase of 36.44 cents to \$1.8787 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net increase of 10.86 cents between the weeks ending April 13 and May 18 from \$2.9090 per pound to \$3.0176 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net decrease of 1.09 cents since mid-April to \$1.1619 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net decrease of 3.7 cents since mid-April to \$0.4029 per pound. 📉
