MARKET SUMMARIES FOR MAY

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 630.8 million pounds of milk to the market during May. Daily deliveries averaged 20.3 million pounds, down 0.1 percent from April. An estimated 254 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 80,115 pounds, down 0.1 percent from April.

Class I producer milk during May totaled 133.1 million pounds, 21.1 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.3 million pounds, down 0.1 percent from April.


Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 292.2 million pounds of milk to the market during May. Daily deliveries averaged 9.4 million pounds, down 26.9 percent from April. An estimated 59 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 159,783 pounds, down 26.9 percent from April.

Class I producer milk during May totaled 110.3 million pounds, 37.7 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.6 million pounds, down 19.9 percent from April.

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks and a net increase for 500-pound barrels. The survey of 40-pound blocks showed a net increase of 8.13 cents between the May 18 and the June 15 surveys, to \$1.8973 per pound. The survey of 500-pound barrels (adjusted to 38% moisture) showed a net increase of 14.81 cents to \$2.0263 per pound.

The AMS butter price showed a net increase of 10.24 cents between the weeks ending May 18 and June 15 from \$3.0173 per pound to \$3.1197 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 1.69 cents since mid-May to \$1.1750 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net increase of 1.44 cents since mid-May to \$0.4186 per pound.
