MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JULY

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 573.3 million pounds of milk to the market during July. Daily deliveries averaged 18.5 million pounds, up 11.9 percent from June. An estimated 200 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 92,473 pounds, up 17.4 percent from June.

Class I producer milk during July totaled 113.7 million pounds, 19.8 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.7 million pounds, up 6.4 percent from June.

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 302.1 million pounds of milk to the market during July. Daily deliveries averaged 9.7 million pounds, down 8.4 percent from June. An estimated 61 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 159,780 pounds, down 8.4 percent from June.

Class I producer milk during July totaled 100.4 million pounds, 33.2 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.2 million pounds, down 2.6 percent from June.

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks of 1.95 cents between the July 19 and the August 16 surveys, to \$1.7359 per pound. The AMS butter price showed a decrease of 9.26 cents between the weeks ending July 19 and August 16 from \$2.5885 per pound to \$2.4959 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed a net increase of 1.59 cents since mid-July to \$1.2878 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net increase of 0.72 cents since mid-July to \$0.5823 per pound.

Class Price Formula Amendments

As a result of the FMMO hearing process, a final rule was published in the Federal Register on January 17, 2025 amending provisions in the 11 Federal Milk Marketing Orders (FMMOS). The amendments include the addition of a Class I ESL adjustment, updating skim milk composition factors, removing 500-pound barrel cheddar cheese prices from the DPMRP survey, updating the Class III and Class IV manufacturing allowances, returning the base Class I skim milk price formula to the higher-of the advanced Class III or Class IV skim milk prices, and updating the Class I differential values.
