MARKET SUMMARIES FOR JANUARY

Pacific Northwest (FO 124)

Producers delivered a total of 523.0 million pounds of milk to the market during January. Daily deliveries averaged 16.9 million pounds, up 1.2 percent from December. An estimated 219 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 77,034 pounds, up 1.2 percent from December.


Class I producer milk during January totaled 134.2 million pounds, 25.7 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 4.3 million pounds, up 3.2 percent from December. ▼

Arizona (FO 131)

Producers delivered a total of 386.8 million pounds of milk to the market during January. Daily deliveries averaged 12.5 million pounds, up 6.7 percent from December. An estimated 61 producers delivered milk to the market during the month. Daily deliveries per producer averaged 204,571 pounds, up 6.7 percent from December.

Class I producer milk during January totaled 107.5 million pounds, 27.8 percent of total producer receipts. Daily usage averaged 3.5 million pounds, down 3.2 percent from December. ▼

CURRENT COMMODITY PRICES

The AMS survey of cheddar cheese prices showed a net increase in prices received for 40-pound blocks of 1.76 cents between the January 17 and the February 14 surveys, to \$1.4191 per pound. The AMS butter price showed a net increase of 24.63 cents between the weeks ending January 17 and February 14 from \$1.4130 per pound to \$1.6593 per pound. The AMS nonfat dry milk showed an increase of 18.76 cents since mid-January to \$1.3790 per pound. The average price for AMS whey showed a net decrease of 0.39 cents since mid-January to \$0.6974 per pound. 🐄
